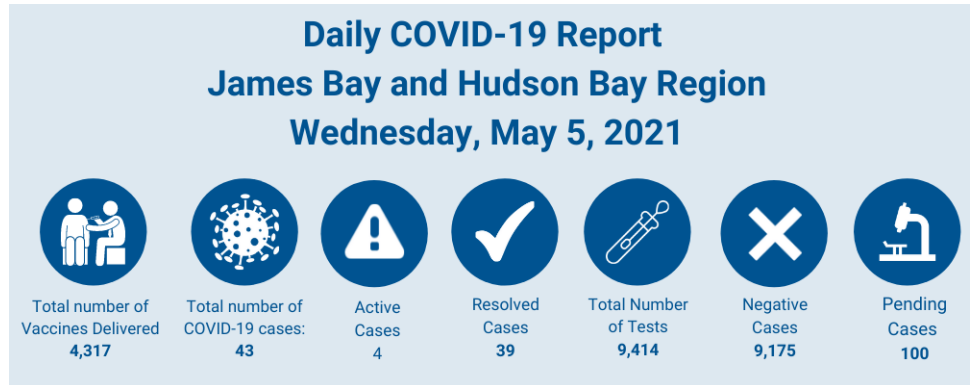

CHANGES IN EFFECT

As of April 17th, 2021 at 12:01am, the Ontario government enhanced public health measures and enforcements of the Emergency Stay-at-Home Order. Home order requiring everyone to remain at home except for essential purposes, such as going to the grocery store or pharmacy, accessing health care services (including getting vaccinated), for outdoor exercise, or for work that cannot be done remotely. 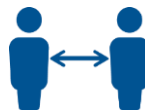
